## PLAY ON WORDS THEATRE

Play On Words Theatre was formed in 1990 and is based in Rochester, Kent UK. The company has produced: *Prostitutes Only Marry in May* (formerly *Sister Queens*), tours of N. Ireland and Scotland; *Tom Crean - Antarctic Explorer* (2001-24), touring Ireland, UK, Australia, USA including a Fringe First at The Edinburgh Festival 2006; *Galway Girl* and *Melody for Medway* Fuse Festival 2009. The company toured Ireland in 2011-2013 with *Our Last Chieftain - O'Sullivan Beara*. Their educational arm has toured *Romeo and Juliet, Macbeth* and numerous workshop performances on many of Shakespeare's other plays, as well as performances on science and history for schools.

Play On Words' production *Only Prostitutes Marry in May* (the relationship between Queen Elizabeth I and Mary Queen of Scots) was seen in 2012 at Waterloo East Theatre, London, where it received a nomination in the Off West End Theatre Awards for best female performance. The company also runs drama summer schools and has co-produced acclaimed and highly successful Christmas shows for 3-6 year olds with *The Creatives* at The Brook Theatre, Chatham, 2010-2022. www.playonwordstheatre.com

# ABOUT TOM CREAN

Tom Crean was born in 1877 in Kerry, Ireland. He joined the Royal Navy at 15 years of age. He served on "Discovery" from 1901 – 1904 and "Terra Nova" 1910 -1913 under Captain Robert Scott, and from 1914 – 1916 served on "Endurance" under Sir Ernest Shackleton. Crean survived for months trapped on the ice floes after the ship was crushed, and journeyed with Shackleton and four others in a 21-foot lifeboat across the South Atlantic (800 miles). They scaled the uncharted glaciers of South Georgia to reach help for their stricken colleagues left behind. Crean received the Albert Medal for bravery. He returned to UK in 1916 to serve out the remaining time of WWI and was medically discharged in 1919. Crean married a girl from Annascaul called Nell Herlihy, and returned home to Ireland. They brought up two daughters, Mary and Eileen. Sadly, their middle daughter Kate died aged four in 1924. Crean remained in Annascaul where he ran a public house with Nell until his death in 1938 of a burst appendix, aged 61.

# THE JOURNEY OF THE PLAY

Tom Crean – Discovering Antarctica; Heroic Tales of Scott, Crean, and Shackleton (also known as Antarctic Explorer and Discovering Antarctica – The Heroic Tales of Shackleton, Crean & Scott), written and performed by Aidan Dooley premiered at The Medway Fuse Festival and then at the New York International Fringe Festival in August 2003, where it won the Best Solo Performance Award. In the same year, the show played the Dublin Fringe Festival where it picked up a Best Actor nomination.

The show originated from a fifteen-minute Living History performance on Tom Crean created by Aidan Dooley for London's National Maritime Museum's Antarctic Exhibition South in 2001. Following the publication of Michael Smith's book about Tom Crean called Unsung Hero, the show was developed over a two-year period with several small tryout performances in Ireland, including a performance in front of Crean's remaining family at the Tom Crean Society's memorial in Annascaul.

Between 2004 and 2005, the show toured to over 30 venues across Ireland, and also played two sell-out seasons at the Northern Stage Theatre Vermont, USA.

2006 saw the show return to the USA playing a sell-out, three-week season at The Sugan Theater at Boston Center for the Arts where the show was nominated for an Outstanding Solo Performance Award at that year's Elliot Norton, Boston Theater Critics Awards. The show then returned to Ireland to play the first of two sell-out, five-week seasons at Andrews Lane Theatre Dublin, the second season following the triumphant success at the 2006 Edinburgh Fringe Festival where the show won a Fringe First Award.

In 2007, after its sell-out success at the Brighton Festival, the show returned to Ireland to play two capacity weeks at Dublin's Olympia Theatre before travelling to the Adelaide Fringe Festival Australia, via seasons in Florida, Vermont, Malta, Dubai, and Geneva. It then returned to the USA to play an eight-week sell-out season at the award-winning Irish Repertory Theatre in New York before returning to the UK to complete a four-week UK tour.

2008 saw the production receive its London premiere at the New End Theatre, where it played a six-week limited run to capacity houses and was awarded the Time Out Critics Choice Award before returning to Dublin for a third sell-out week engagement at the Olympia Theatre which, by popular demand, then transferred to the Gaiety Theatre Dublin for a further two weeks.

Since 2009, the show has continued to tour extensively both in Ireland and internationally.

It was seen in New Zealand at the International Arts Festival. In 2015, 2017, and 2019 it returned by popular demand to Ireland and UK. In 2020, COVID forced the show to take a hiatus, like the rest of us, but in 2023 it was seen in Vancouver and returned to the Olympia in Dublin for the sixth residency with a two-week run. The show then toured Ireland and the UK to finish that year. In 2024, we saw a return by popular demand to Vancouver, an Alaskan Cruise with Cunard, shows in Dublin and Kerry, and finally to finish this amazing year, Aidan is delighted to be in this residency here at Western Gold.

# CAST AND CREATIVE TEAM BIOS



Aidan Dooley - Tom Crean Aidan is from Galway, Ireland. He trained at the Guilford School of Acting and works as a freelance actor, writer, and director in London. Highlights of his career as an actor include *Translations* - National Theatre, London. *Philadelphia Here I Come* - Wyndhams Theatre London. *Elegies for Angels* - Criterion Theatre London. *DA* - White Bear Theatre London, *Players and Painted Stage, Last Apache Reunion* - SOS Theatre Bristol, National Tours of *Julius Caesar* and *Romeo and Juliet, Tales of the Lost Formicans* - Bristol Old Vic Theatre Company, *Galway Girl* and *Melody* in the UK Fuse Festival, *Crossed Keys* -

Eastern Angles Theatre Company, and Tales of Snowy the Fox - The Brook Creatives Theatre Co.

He first performed Tom Crean - Antarctic Explorer 20 years ago at The South Pole Inn, Annascaul for Tom Crean's family, and then at the Medway Fuse Festival followed by The New York International Fringe Festival (Best Solo Show Award Winner). He has also been nominated for awards at The Dublin Festival, Adelaide Fringe Festival, and The Elliot Norton Theatre Critics Award Boston, and in 2006 won the prestigious Fringe First at Edinburgh. Aidan toured his other solo show Our Last Chieftain - O'Sullivan Beara from 2011 to 2013.

Aidan's book TRAVELS with TOM CREAN - Antarctic Explorer was published in 2016. It tells the story of his journey with Tom Crean: how the play was written, and how it grew from an unknown show with an unknown actor into an award-winning hit that has been performed all over the world.

Aidan has worked for many years developing various performance pieces and historical characters for all the National Museums in England, including the National Maritime Museum, Greenwich where the Tom Crean show started. He is a Co-Director of Play On Words Theatre Company and is also an Associate Lecturer in Drama at Canterbury Christ Church University, Kent. He lives in Rochester with his wife Miriam and has two children, Liam and Nancy. www.aidandooley.co.uk

Western Gold Theatre was founded in 1994 by Joy Coghill O.C. in response to the dearth of roles for veteran professional artists in the Vancouver area. It is one of only two professional theatre companies in Canada solely devoted to providing work for senior (55+) artists. We are committed to centering the voices and supporting the stories of seniors and elders across cultures and communities. We also take great pride in the opportunities we offer to emerging theatre artists.

We have commissioned, developed, and staged nine new Canadian plays as well as produced a further 12 mainstage presentations from major playwrights. In 2012, we launched the highly popular ON OUR FEET (OOF!) series: fully staged readings with all the hallmarks of a full production.

In 2020, in response to COVID-19, we initiated VIRTUAL GOLD: online theatrical offerings, creative workshops, and cultural conversations. In 2021 we began a Creative Accessibility Program specifically designed for senior artists, and, in 2023, we launched our inaugural HAVE A SENIOR MOMENT FESTIVAL, a curated, multi-discipline series celebrating the performing arts for old folx and/or by old folx!

Western Gold has been helmed for the majority of its time by a number of Canada's leading theatre artists including Founder Joy Coghill O.C., Artistic Directors Pamela Hawthorne, Colleen Winton, Anna Hagan, and General Manager Glenn MacDonald—trailblazers all. Tanja Dixon-Warren was appointed Artistic Director in 2019.

Working in the theatre is a vicarious life. Actors and many other theatre artists—at minimum industry standard—get paid less per week than many people get paid per day, and in some cases per hour. For senior artists, this is further compounded because work opportunities are limited. Few roles are written for characters over 55, and they are frequently stereotypical characters that amplify preconceived notions of old people. Statistics cite the median age for a working actor is: Women Age 37 / Men Age 46. OUCH!

PAL's intimate theatre has a house capacity of less than 100 and must sell to near capacity. In order for *Tom Crean – Discovering Antarctica* to break even, more than 1190 people must purchase a ticket.

\*Average ticket price is calculated by totaling all ticket prices (including full price, concession prices for youth, students, PAL residents, and members of the community with financial restrictions, comps for volunteers, and promotional comps which offset our marketing budget) and dividing it by the number of ticket prices offered.

# CREATIVE ACCESSIBILITY at WESTERN GOLD THEATRE

Western Gold Theatre was founded with the aim of supporting, nurturing, and providing opportunities for senior artists and audiences.

Instead of hiding the normal experiences of the life process, we aim to shine a light on them and make them integral to creation, design, rehearsal, and performance processes.

It is no secret that challenges come with aging, including physical mobility, stamina, memory loss, cultural displacement, and the inherent emotional barriers that result. We believe all older adults can and should participate in the arts—and not just any arts, but high-quality, innovative, and contemporary arts that engage them fully and reflect the lives they lead.

Thus, as part of every project we embark upon, we examine these barriers and challenges and find opportunities and solutions therein.

## The questions we ask are:

- What are the barriers?
- How do we fully support senior artists on stage/in rehearsal?
- Are there commonly used accessibility tools we can apply to theatrical creation?
- How do we bring practices such as viewpoints, Laban (a method and language for describing, visualizing, interpreting, and documenting human movement), or biomechanics to senior artists?
- What new technologies and digital media can be used to support our artists and audiences?
- How can we ensure cultural comfort?
- How can we aesthetically illuminate the experience of seniors' day-to-day living?

**FOR THE AUDIENCE:** This means ensuring our venue is fully accessible and offering ASL and VocalEye performances for each production as well as audio assist. It means we acknowledge, support, and advocate for cultural ceremony and protocols.

**FOR THE ARTIST:** This means actors may be seen using an earpiece / having a prompter to the side of the stage / integrating a teleprompter into the set design / incorporating the script as a prop (i.e. a diary, a memoir, a journal) / the set being wheelchair accessible / adjusting the lighting / using sound cues to facilitate memory / increasing visual markers, or only rehearsing two hours per day for six weeks, instead of seven hours a day for two weeks. It means we acknowledge, support, and advocate for cultural safety and protocols. It varies and adapts to each artist and each production.

This is what you will see on our stage: an artistic form suited to senior artists; one which also reflects the experience of our audience. It embraces adaptability and, at heart, celebrates the notion that life experience fully informs artistic practice.






